In fact, the ancient, anonymous origin of such texts serves as a kind of authentication. But, scientific texts demand an author's name as validation. Text has become a kind of private property, owned by the author. With the rise of scientific method, on the other hand, scientific texts and mathematical proofs were no longer seen as authored texts but as discovered truths. The ever-present pressure of promotions and name-game only muddies the water further.

And then move on to the intricacies of Pterygium management, Cosmetic Reformations. Some light is thrown on the retinal arterial occlusions and so also on management of traumatic cataract.


